Plymouth Pétanque Club

Plymouth Pétanque has been meeting regularly every Wednesday and Sunday throughout April, May and June with an average attendance of around 30 players. We have been very lucky with the weather, having been rained on only twice during this period.

'The objectives of The Club shall be to promote the amateur sport of, and community participation in, Pétanque in Plymouth and the surrounding area.'

To help fulfil this objective we organised a friendly invitation tournament on Sunday May 8th to which we invited players from the various small venues in the Plymouth area that have a pétanque facility. Three of our public parks in Plymouth have single game pétanque pistes that have been put in by the City Council. Unfortunately, they have not been particularly well used (except perhaps for the one on the Hoe where the local Residents' Association meet on a weekly basis in the summer months) and we, as a club, are trying to find ways of getting them used a bit more. The piste in Devonport Park had fallen into disrepair and a small team of volunteers from our club recently joined forces with the Friends of Devonport Park and gave it a bit of a refurbishment and we are pleased to see that it is now being used much more. Who knows, maybe we will soon be having enough players at these venues to form a local Plymouth League?

Our team in the Devon League have been performing pretty well considering that all but one of them had never played pétanque before joining us. Much of the credit for this must go to Devon Pétanque's own coach, Thierry Hacq, who came to us last November and gave us a wonderful day of coaching. To this day, whenever we put a first shot 9" directly in front of the jack we call it doing a "Thierry"!!

Quite a few of our members are also now starting to enter various competitive events in Devon and beyond and are gaining experience of competitive play at the next level. We are making new contacts and acquiring more knowledge and skills through informal discussions at regional events. A couple

of us attended the EPA National Championships at ISCA in May and our thanks go to our own Mike Carroll, who made three journeys to ISCA and back from Plymouth that weekend to give assistance with the preparation and clearing of the pistes for the event.

Our regular Sunday and Wednesday sessions remain totally social. The tea breaks (and sometimes fish and chip breaks!) being as important as the games themselves. We are now looking forward to our charity event to be held on Sunday June 19th involving dressing-up and an auction of promises.

HONITON PETANQUE

On April 1st we completed our inaugural year and on all fronts have been very pleased with our progress. With many new people signing up in the first year to try the sport, we were keen to see how many would renew membership in April. To date we stand around the mid-twenties in number with new enquiries still coming in. We continue to publicise ourselves locally mainly through press reports and social media, but word of mouth is also helping.

Our EPA club registration has now been completed which we believe gives the club a more sporting outlook, and pleased by the number of members who have already purchased competition boules. We are also actively encouraging members to take part in regional events and competitions to gain experience of other players and terrains. In May ten of our members enjoyed taking part in the East Devon Charity Shield and acquitted themselves well with a good showing in the Plate.

We are aiming a bit higher now and hope to chalk up that first success soon.

We have also arranged a series of friendly challenge matches, and in the first of these in May we entertained Royal Oak PC, a touring side from Shropshire (Severn Valley Petanque). We managed to win the match 6-2 but importantly it gave the chance for more members to gain some team experience in a relaxed atmosphere. In the second match in June East Devon PC (Sidmouth) were the visitors and we also won that one 5-3. The wins also gave the club a welcome confidence boost.
